<p>Group arrives in Williamsburg, VA area and is met by a WorldStrides representative.</p> <p><b>Jamestown Settlement</b> Guided Tour "Government and Leadership" – Visit the original site where the three ships landed in 1607, the Powhatan Indian Village, and the replica of James Fort. Tour the museum housing thousands of items which were unearthed at this 400 year old site</p> <p>Dinner</p> <p>Hotel check-in</p> <p><b>Evening Program*</b> <i>"Hysterical History"</i> - Get a modern and merry view of 400 years of Historic Triangle stories with Chester the Crab comic book author Bentley Boyd. Students help the author draw a historical cartoon based on their experience</p> <p>Return to hotel</p>	<p>Breakfast</p> <p><b>Colonial Williamsburg Scavenger Hunt Study Visit</b> – Enjoy a fast-paced walking tour of Colonial Williamsburg. This hands-on exploration provides students with clues leading them to various colonial trade shops. Collaborate and think creatively to solve each clue and then enter the trade shops to participate in re-enactments and learn about everyday life in 18th-century Williamsburg</p> <p>Lunch</p> <p><b>Colonial Williamsburg Study Visit Continued</b> – Participate in Revolutionary City, an interactive "street theatre," visit Great Hopes Plantation, a "middling" farm, and experience different aspects of colonial life as you see the jail, Capitol, and post office</p> <p>Dinner</p> <p><b>Evening Program*</b> <i>"Storyteller"</i> – Experience 18<sup>th</sup>-century African American stories while participating in a dynamic performance with costumed interpreters</p> <p>Return to hotel</p>	<p>Breakfast Hotel check-out</p> <p><b>Yorktown Victory Center</b> Learn about life in Virginia during the Revolutionary War, from a Continental Army Encampment, galleries, and farmstead</p> <p><b>Yorktown Battlefields</b> Drive to Surrender Field, the actual location where the British surrendered to General Washington's army, probably the most decisive event of the American Revolution. Walk to Cornwallis' cave on the riverfront and through the town where there are still 18<sup>th</sup>-century musket balls in some houses</p> <p>Lunch</p> <p><b>Plantation Visit</b> Visit with soldiers and civilians from Civil War Virginia at Endview, or visit Shirley Plantation, the oldest in Virginia, and one of many plantations located along the historic James River</p> <p>Group departs for home</p> <p><i>*Evening Programs may vary depending on group's interest.</i></p> <p><i>Note: Travel time from different parts of the country may modify this itinerary.</i></p>
